Class Description



In this third year Pre-AP Honors Spanish course, you will build upon what you have learned the past two years and further develop your communicative skills, as well as delve a little into the 6 World Language AP themes. There will be a heavy emphasis on all four modes of communication: reading, writing, speaking, and listening at the Pre-AP level so that you will have the skills, confidence, and practice to continue onto AP Spanish Language. This course will require you to step out of your comfort zone and speak in Spanish on a daily basis, watch and read texts by native speakers for native speakers, as well as write and present to groups of Spanish speakers.


