

<u>Assignments</u>

To pass the AP exam, you'll need to master the tasks above by practicing.

- Weekly Exams: You will take quizzes every day that will be almost identical to the tasks on the AP exam.
- <u>Recordings</u>: There will be activities where I will ask you to speak spontaneously about any given topic, similar to the AP exam.
- <u>Essays</u>: You will practice writing formally using sources to support your thesis.
- <u>Projects</u>: You will be asked to complete different projects throughout the year.

Presentations

- Weekly Charlas: Every week during first semester, students will give a short 2-minute presentation on a given topic. The date and topic will be assigned ahead of time.
- <u>Cultural Presentations</u>: Every week during second semester, students will present a presentation about a cultural topic that falls under the AP themes.
- *The purpose of these activities is to prepare students for the AP exam, not to torture them. There are sections of the AP exam where students will have to complete similar activities.
